“From Healing to Wholeness” part 2 Sun June 17, 2018

- I. **Psalm 103:1-5**
 - A. The Connection of Sin & Disease
 1. Remember Sin is defined by the Holy Spirit as “anything that separates you from His presence.”
 2. When you are separated from His presence, evil has the opportunity to invade your life.
 - All Sickness is Evil; and all evil comes from Satan.
 - Healing is Good; and all healing comes from God.
 - **James 1:13-17** *“Every good and perfect gift (benefit) is from above.”*
 - All sickness exists under the authority of the curse; and the curse CANNOT abide in your life unless it has “legal” permission. (the problem is most people have been giving sickness permission without knowledge.)
 3. It is important to mention that if you continue in sin, sickness has a right to remain:
 - **John 5:14** *“Go and sin no more lest a WORST thing come upon you.”*
 - **John 8:11** *“Neither do I CONDEMN thee; go and sin no more.”*
 - God is never the one condemning you; He’s trying to protect you.
 - Romans 6:23** *“The wages of sin is death...”*
 - B. The Connection between Forgiveness & Healing (**Psalm 103:3**)
 1. Just as sin and disease are connected, God will always reveal the answer to the problem!
 2. **Isaiah 53:5 / I Peter 2:24 / Matthew 8:16-17** (Spiritual & Physical)
 3. **Mark 11:24-26** (Forgiveness from God depends upon your forgiveness of others; God never withholds anything good from His kids. But your unforgiveness will limit God’s power from being manifested in your life.)
- II. Developing Faith in The Healer (Jehovah-Rapha)
 - A. **Acts 14:8-10**
 1. Faith comes by hearing and hearing by the Word of God
 2. Jesus wants to heal us and make us whole; people that received from Him in the Bible came to Him in faith (believing with actions following)
 - B. **James 4:7-8**
 1. When we are properly submitted, nothing can remain broken or missing in our lives!
